




Employment Rate of 15 to 64 year-olds with / without disability

Job Position of 15 to 64 year-olds with / without disability





- Hiring Quota Policy
- Disability Concept
- Wage Subsidies

Employment policy in Korea

- 1. Hiring Quota Scheme
 - since 1991, enforced

- Public sector 3%, Private Sector 2.7%

- Financial Penalty

Employment policy in Netherlands

1. Hiring Quota Scheme

- Since 2015, Participation Act enforced
- Employers and government guarantee jobs (100.000 and 25.000 respectively), or quota scheme will be enforced

Employment policy in Netherlands

- 2. Disability concept
- Occupational Disability
- a condition in which a worker is unable to perform the functions required to complete a job satisfactorily because of disease or accident.
- Employment and income depends on level of working ability
 - Encouraging working through financial incentives


Employment policy in Korea

- 2. Disability concept
- Disability Concept based on Medical Model
 - Disability Ratings System by Medical Conditions
 - Welfare Service System by Medical Conditions
 - Imbalance of welfare, Low employment

Employment policy in Netherlands

3. wage subsidies

- Wage subsidies stimulate employment of people incapable of earning minimum wages



Employment policy in Korea 3. wage subsidies

Employment policy in Korea

3. Wage subsidies

-2014, CRPD recommended that Korean government should take steps to fill the gap between productivity and minimum wage for the people incapable of earning minimum wages.

Separate Special Education

- Separate Special Education
 - 1920, legally recognized
 - in the late of 20th, concerned

- Inclusive Education
 - Act on Expertise Center (2003)
 - Pupil Bound Budget
 - Right to Education

Situations of access to education

Coalition for Inclusion(2010)

The number of pupils that receive no education because of their disabilities is estimated in 2,000 to 5,000.

Minister of Education (2012)

In 2012, over 3,000 pupils are in day care centres instead of schools because they are considered incapable of being educated.

Situations of access to education

Law Firm Judion(2012)


Relating to neglecting parents' legal duty to enrol their children to school, parents are acquitted in such cases because judges find that parents face schools that refuse to admit their children with disability.

Dutch Equal Treatment Commission (2012)

Relating to refusal of admittance to a school. In 7 of the 13 cased the ETC judged that refusal by the school was unjustified.

Situations on quality of education

Education Inspectorate(2010)



- Act on Appropriate Education(2014)
 - tailor made education
 - reducing the cost and improving the quality
 - School Board's responsibility to seek an appropriate place for a student with disability


Evaluations on Act on Appropriate Education (2014)

- The Coalition for Inclusion
 - to endorse appropriate education instead of inclusion may be contradictory to CRPD
- The leder(in)
 - supporting government's policy

Education of People with disabilities in Korea

- Act on Anti-Discrimination based on Disability(2008)
 - Cases of Rejected admission diminished

Act on Anti-Discrimination based on Disability (2008)




UN CRPD's Concerns(2014)
