

Invitation: Pre-conference workshop: 'Included in training and work: Transforming policies and practices for disabled people'

Dear Sir or Madam

We would like to invite you to the **Pre-Conference workshop** on **29th November** at **14.30**, where we will present a new report: *Included in Training and Work: Transforming Policies and Practices for Disabled People*. This report is a call to action that asks professionals to recognise and change policies and practices that currently form barriers for disabled people in vocational education and employment.

We began with international collaborative research, which was then further debated and finalised during the Lorentz Center workshop of the same name in August 2017. The resulting report zooms in on key issues, such as skill-matching, supported choice-making, applying Universal Design in education and work, addressing bullying in adult education and workplaces, fostering inclusion, and preventing disability discrimination. It has been developed with extensive participation by disabled people who have become experts in their own right.

We will present key findings and make recommendations. There will also be time to debate these recommendations, and to discuss what steps could be taken by organisations like the UWV to implement them.
