THE REPORT

- Report will be something simple and relatively short:
 - short summaries
 - bullet points
 - key references in the back
- Target audience: UWV and similar national education/work agencies, DPOs, EU/UN bodies
- It needs to be very clear what we recommend e.g. you might want to do this/don't do that in training, HR, work placement etc. and here's why
- Sections to follow the aims/goals, barriers, solutions/best practices/policy recommendations structure
- Every section with a few good examples of good practice – short (1/2 to 1 page)

THE REPORT

- We also have the idea of a film version – UDL in action! (even shorter) – in Dutch and English
- So the examples of barriers or good practice we use should be *filmed* (interviews, observations)... whenever possible...or in some cases we could with permission use existing film examples
- Subtitling – who's good at this?

THE REPORT

- Mitzi Waltz will edit the report
- An 'almost final' draft will be completed by the end of October
 - This will go to all workshop participants for comment
 - Comments will be read and whenever possible actioned by 20 November
- It will be presented to the UWV on 29 November and have an informal launch at the DSIN Disability Conference 30 November – 2 December

INCLUDED IN TRAINING AND WORK: **THE BOOK**

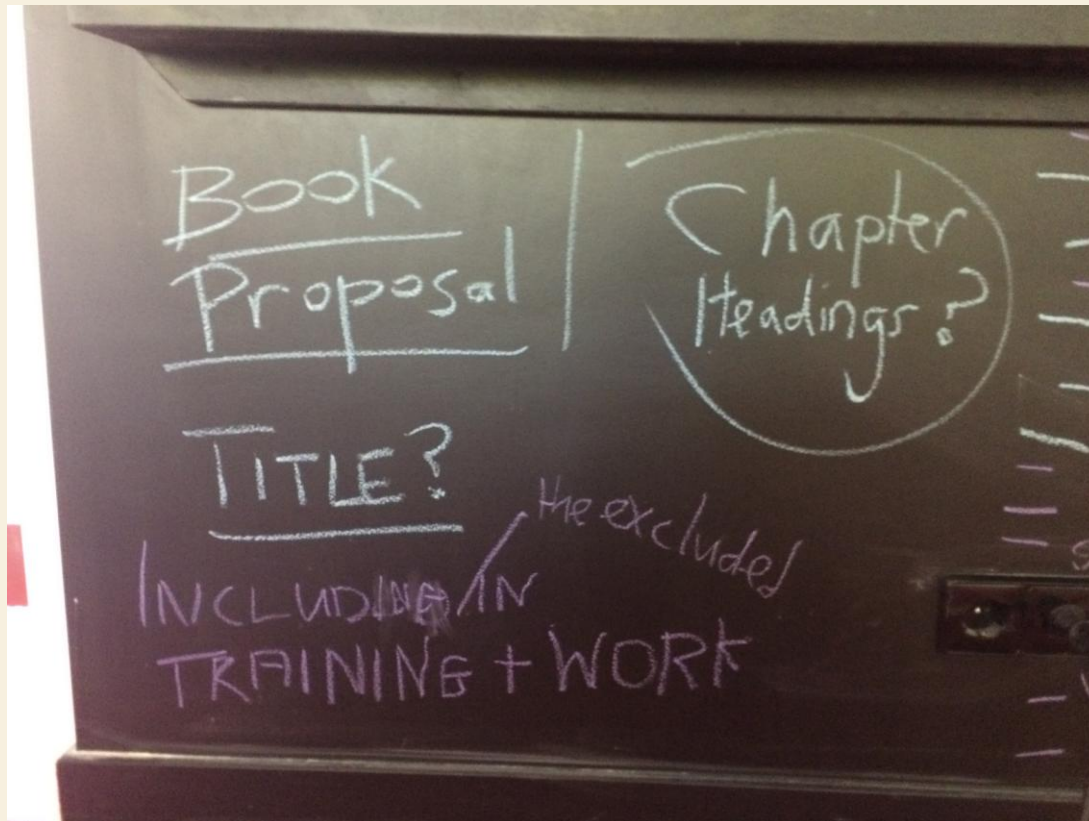
Authorship model:

- Everyone who has participated in the workshop will be listed as an author.

Editorial panel/team will:

- Write and deal with the book proposal.
- Make sure everyone is clear about what they are writing
- Give chapter writers guidelines about length etc. based on what we get from the publisher.
- Give chapter writers a structure that they can follow for every chapter.
- The editorial panel's main job is to make sure sections come in on time and then to make sure that texts are not repeating each other, that they work as a whole document/flow.

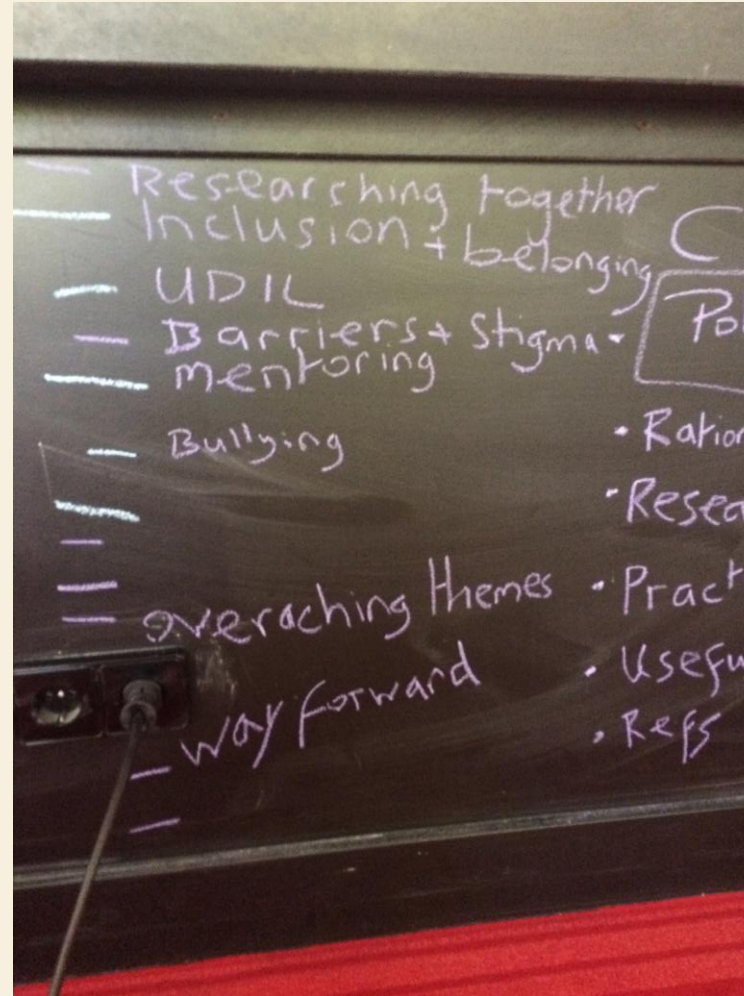
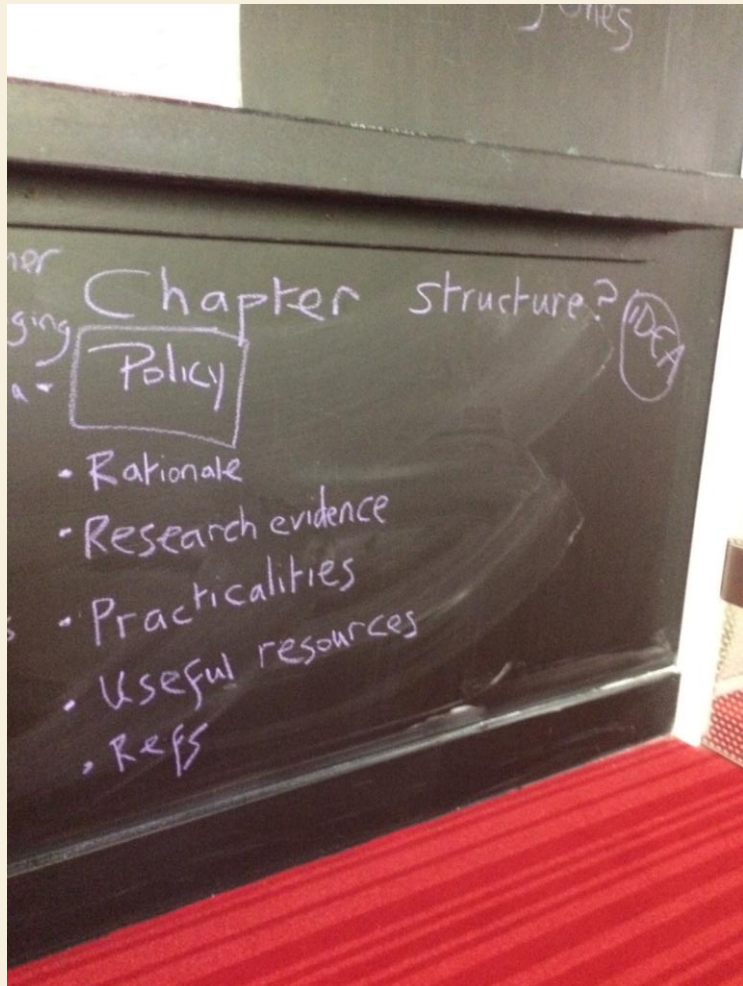

INCLUDED IN TRAINING AND WORK: **THE BOOK**

Chapter writing / content / process:

- People may write their own texts or may collaborate on texts. Our preference is for collaboration like we have been doing.
 - Starting from what we have now, using the report process to refine key points
 - Same workgroups or reformulate these?
- Chapter authors should seek a good example (personal story of goal, barrier or best practices) if one wasn't already found during the report stage.

INCLUDED IN TRAINING AND WORK: **THE BOOK**

Production:

- Not sure of timetable yet – the publisher will have some control here.
- Chapters will have a due date and will then be assembled into a whole.
- There will be a chance to for all authors to see the ‘almost final’ draft and comment.
- After this final comment/edit stage, Mitzi will do the final editing run as regards publisher’s requirements (i.e. final editing for length, etc.), Table of Contents, indexing etc.

Translation?
